Year In Review

The International Society for Burn Injuries (ISBI) enjoyed a very successful year! In 2024, ISBI continued to become stronger and more relevant in the Global Burn Community. Membership increased to 631 from 459 members in 2023. The Society continues to be financially healthy!

The 22nd Congress of the ISBI was held in Birmingham, UK, in collaboration with the British Burn Association's Annual Meeting. The congress exceeded all expectations in terms of overall attendance as well as Exhibitor and Sponsor participation. We had the third largest attendance in our history (behind only Miami and Edinburgh) with 1064 delegates from 64 countries around the world. The scientific program, Pre-Congress symposia/workshops, and plenary sessions received very positive feedback from the delegates. ISBI awarded \$17,000 in the form of scholarships to members from Low Middle Income Countries to support their attendance at the congress. We would like to thank our outgoing President, Dr. Folke Sjoberg for his amazing leadership during his 2022-2024 presidency. Our new President, Dr. David Harrington, hit the road running immediately after the congress in Birmingham. Under his leadership, the new ISBI Bylaws and Mission statement were adapted in September of 2024. President Harrington rolled out our newest pilot program, "ISBI Burn Center Assessment Program," in October 2024. This 6-year pilot program aims to help LMICs grow and develop their burn care programs. As part of the ISBI's Education Program, we participated in a Rehabilitation Training Program in collaboration with Physicians for Peace that was designed to train Burn Therapists practicing in Tanzania. Additionally, our team conducted a Pre-Congress workshop in Santiago Chile, the site of our 2026 ISBI Congress. ISBI was instrumental in developing and producing the inaugural and very successful "World Burns Week" in November 2024. Currently, preparations are underway for the 2025 ISBI Regional Conference in Thessaloniki, Greece and our 2026 Biennial Congress in Santiago, Chile.

One of the highlights of the year must be the achievement of our Journal *Burns*, which achieved an Impact Factor of 3.2 in 2024! We would like to thank our outgoing Editor of *Burns*, Dr. Steven Wolf for his leadership and commitment to burn research during his tenure as the Editor of *Burns*. We are very excited to welcome the new *Burns* Editor, Dr. Lee Cancio. Dr. Cancio has already made an impact on decreasing the backlog of manuscripts waiting to be reviewed and moved to publication. ISBI wishes to thank our outgoing Editor of *Burns Open*, Dr. David Greenhalgh, who has been instrumental in elevating the journal's quality and numbers of submissions. ISBI welcomes Dr. Anthony Papp as the new Editor of Burns Open, and we wish him the best in his new role.

We have much to look forward to in 2025! Our Society will continue to grow and develop strategic partnerships that will allow us to fulfill our mission and become even more relevant in the International Burn Care Community.






2024 Membership








Membership by Profession





- Sponsor hands-on approach to burn training for the entire burn team
- Create a community for knowledge exchange
- Improve the quality of burn care across all regions of the world

ISBI Burn Center Audit Pilot Program Proposal ISBI Burn Center Audit Program (ISBI BCAP)

Background

Burn practitioners in low and middle resource countries often face a shortfall between the care they would like to provide their burn patients and the care they actually deliver due to a shortage of resources and/or personnel. They are also hindered due to the lack of ability to close this gap because they are oftentimes a single voice who is advocating to their hospital administration and governmental Departments of Health. Their

advocacy might be strengthened if they could reference an external international standard of care and have an international partner.

The ISBI is in a unique position to develop international partnerships

Through this program, the ISBI aims to elevate the standard of burn care in resource limited environments.

and to deliver education and training to burn centers in low and middle income countries around the world. Through this program, the ISBI aims to elevate the standard of burn care in resource limited environments. The 4 parts of a Quality Program are 1) Setting Standards 2) Building Infrastructure 3) Data Collection and 4) Confirmation of Compliance with standards/peer review. The ISBI has already taken a first step to create worldwide burn Quality Process by the publication in 2007 of the "One World, One Standard" document. This standard of care document could be the catalyst for the next steps of building infrastructure, data collection, and peer review in low and middle resource countries through a process of Burn Center Audits. While these audits are an extension outside of the ISBI's traditional educational role, this proposal is consistent with the ISBI's mission of improving the care of burn injured patient world-wide. This pilot project would last 6 years and would hopefully visit and audit burn centers in up to 8 countries.

ISBI & PHYSICIANS FOR PEACE PARTNER TO PROVIDE A REHABILITATION EDUCATION AND TRAINING IN TANZANIA

During the first week of March 2024, ISBI partnered with Physicians for Peace to deliver a five-day rehabilitation workshop to three Tanzanian therapists working at the Bugando Medical Center Burn Unit in Mwanza. This workshop focused on intensive skills training, developing clinical judgement, and utilizing locally available resources to provide high quality Burn Rehabilitation. Recognizing the limitations of a short intensive program, International Medical Educators, Megan McCarthy and Deborah Knight, along with PFP Administrator, Leslie Long, developed a one-year virtual mentorship program to ensure carryover and to provide ongoing feedback and professional development. Through an additional partnership with Ohana One, the mentorship program evolved to include the use of Vusix Glasses, which allows for observation of the implementation of therapy skills and ongoing feedback in real-time. Mentorship sessions included instruction on evidence-based practice, discussion of challenging cases, and guidance through the navigation of obstacles common to burn therapists. The final two mentoring sessions will be completed in April and May, 2025. The feedback received from the therapists in Mwanza has thus far been overwhelmingly positive. We look forward to receiving the formal report outlining the deliverables set forth at the inception of this project.





SURVIVAL OF THE BURN PATIENT BEYOND 48 HOURS

In October, ISBI conducted the "Survival of the Burn Patient Beyond 48 Hours" workshop as part of the 2024 Chilean Burn Congress in Santiago Chile. The topics of the workshop were "Team Building and Growing the Burn Unit" and topics on "Wound Care", "Surgery" and "Reconstruction". The workshop was attended by 43 physicians, nurses and therapists from Chile, Argentina, Brazil, Mexico and Colombia. Feedback from the attendees was very positive and indicated that the program design which included interactive sessions and live discussions is preferred. We look forward to more of these workshops in 2025!

ISBI Welcomes Dr. Cancio, the new Editor of Burns!



Dr. Leopoldo Cancio is a native of Washington, DC. He graduated from the Heights School, Washington, DC (1976), Amherst College, Amherst, Massachusetts (AB, 1980), Catholic University of America, Washington, DC (MA, 1983), and Georgetown University School of Medicine, Washington, DC (MD, 1987). He trained in Surgery at Brooke Army Medical Center, Fort Sam Houston, Texas. He then joined the US Army Institute of Surgical Research (USAISR, the US Army Burn Center), where he was the last surgeon trained in burns by Dr. Basil A. Pruitt, Jr. During a 27-year military career he deployed several times to conflict zones and fire disasters around the world. He now serves as the Director of the USAISR Burn Center. He is a Professor of Surgery

(Adjoint) at the University of Texas (UT Health San Antonio), and a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons, the American College of Critical Care Medicine, the American Surgical Association, and the American Burn Association. He is the author or co-author of about 300 publications. His current research encompasses all aspects of burn care, from resuscitation through long-term outcomes, He is most interested in improving the quality of life of burn survivors around the world.
