
Chapalita, one of the most beautiful and emblematic neighborhoods in the city—inspired by the mythical garden cities of renowned English urban planner Ebenezer L. Howard—, can be found in this area. Its tree-lined streets along with their hub and spoke distribution provide it with a unique personality. Over the years, restaurants, cafés, and shops have been opened here, but despite the changes, it still retains its original identity.

Expo Guadalajara, the second largest exhibition center in Latin America, is the preferred site for major congresses, conventions, and commercial exhibitions in the city, and not to mention, every year it hosts the International Book Fair. For its part, the Plaza del Sol, Mexico's first shopping center and one of the most visited in Guadalajara, is another essential stop.

The area is also home to Metropolitan Park, which covers an area of more than 247 acres and is the ideal spot for enjoying the pleasant midafternoon weather. However, the neighborhood is best represented by its restaurants. Local, or Tapatío, cuisine is available in the Expo area with interesting options like antojitos, typical Mexican food, pasta, steaks, and signature cuisine, among others.

Tourism in Guadalajara

No one is surprised that the capital of Jalisco has regained its splendor before the eyes of the world. Considered the jewel of Mexico in the mid-20th-century (and home to Mexico's most emblematic symbols, including tequila and mariachis), Guadalajara has now redefined its identity with interesting concepts in architecture, art, design, and urban life in general.

There is no doubt that the "Pearl of the West" is still a fruitful source of artists and scholars who have understood the signs of the times without losing faith in their roots. Here a dynamic and attractive cultural life echo through the painted pottery of the Tonaltecas, valleys filled with blue agave, sunsets over Chapala, architecture marked by horizons and quarried stone patios, the smell of damp soil, aging tequila, and Charro nostalgia.

These elements, along with countless others, endow this fair province with a cosmopolitan face unafraid to show its creative and vivid potential. Guadalajara's present is lived on multiple levels: it is a city where history, celebration, nature, the artisan tradition, and good drinking are interwoven to highlight Mexico's most authentic region.

Getting to know Guadalajara takes time and requires the ability to interpret layers and layers of multiple and simultaneous phenomena.

Downtown Area

The City From its Origin

We could say that the central block of Guadalajara is one of the most interesting areas in any Latin American city. With strong links to its colonial past, the city center provides a catalog of colonial history, while its 20th-century growth has left a deep modern imprint on the urban landscape. It is definitely worth a visit.

The most emblematic area is the Cruz de Plazas, designed in the 20th-century, which consists of four public squares that surround the cathedral to form a Latin cross. These points feature the buildings that serve to define Tapatía identity, including the Government Palace, the San Agustín and La Merced churches, and the gardens of the Rotonda and the Plaza de Armas, with its beautiful art nouveau kiosk. The Regional Museum of Guadalajara, a former 18th-century convent, and the Degollado Theater, a symbol of Mexican fine arts, head this group of buildings.

In the center is the Paseo Alcalde, an urban project that attempts to replicate the old street of San Francisco—a road that connects the Sanctuary neighborhood (where the old Civil Hospital and the Panteón de Belén are located) with the San Francisco and Aranzazú churches, crown jewels of the Mexican Baroque. From here you can see Juarez Square and Agua Azul Park.

However, the real treasure in the city center is the Hospicio Cabañas, the city's most important neoclassical building, with a history that today is revived in the form of an internationally recognized cultural and artistic center.






This area, comprised of Zapopan and the city's northern neighborhoods, makes it abundantly clear that Guadalajara is growing and changing at great speed. Hotels, apartment towers, corporate offices, luxury shopping malls, the best restaurants in the city, museums, and cultural and entertainment venues, are just some of the attractions found in the area.

Today, Zapopan is really an extension of Guadalajara, a traditional and essential destination featuring modern and classical architecture as well as historic sites. Here you should visit the recently renovated 20 de Noviembre walkway—where you will find cantinas, cafés, restaurants, and food stalls—which leads to the Plaza de las Américas, the Zapopan Art Museum, and the famous basilica, a Baroque Franciscan sanctuary.

The financial area of Guadalajara, for its part, features traditional neighborhoods like Providencia, where there has been an interesting transformation over the last 10 years. This tree-filled zone is full of life, with parks, median strips, boutiques, cafés, and restaurants.

The neighborhood is adjacent to the Los Colomos urban forest and connects with two of the city's main roads: Américas and López Mateos.



Chapultepec Area

Creative Effervescence

Chapultepec is synonymous with effervescence. In this part of the city, you will find the best of the party along with numerous cultural, gastronomic, and artistic options that will make you fall in love with everything Tapatío.

The area's dynamism dates to the beginning of the 21st-century, when international trends of the independent and urban were consolidated under the term hipster. Guadalajara also experienced this change, and today the area is a kaleidoscope of the diversity of both the city and its inhabitants.

The backbone is the old Paseo Lafayette, renamed Chapultepec, which is an avenue that crosses the modern boundaries of the oldest streets: from the Plaza de la República to the Niños Héroes roundabout, passing by the magnificent fountains designed by Ignacio Díaz Morales.

Its charm lies in being able to witness Guadalajara's different stages of urban development in one area, revealing the city one moment in history at a time. In the 19th-century, the promenade linked the Americana and Lafayette neighborhoods, built in French and Victorian styles, and the houses from this era still remain standing today. Later, the area became the seedbed for the Tapatía School of Architecture, a stylistic movement that defined the aesthetic of many artists, including, of course, the only Mexican Pritzker Prize winner: Luis Barragán. Its constructions are still standing and are well-worth admiring.




Security in Guadalajara

- For the security strategy, we will use all of our resources andinfrastructure, Guadalajara has one of the mosttechnologically advanced public security systems in thecountry, with local organization and a multi-task Command Coordination, Communications, Computer and Control Center called (C5 Escudo Urbano) that integrates the availability of a digital video surveillance network with 6,540 video cameras which covers most of the key zones, strategic areas, transport, buildings, venues, streets, avenues and transit intersections in the metro area.
- It also has a radio communication system that is interconnected with all the emergency services and authorities in the State of Jalisco, and uses a variety of networktechnology and frecuencies such as Tetra Pol, Astro-P25, Tetra Pol IP, LTE and has approximately 19,700 radio users.
- The C5Command Center has an Emergency Response "911" number that recieves in a daily bases 20,000 calls attended 24 hours by the operational team of 261 officers in different shifts. The equipment in the city has also 334 license plate readercameras
- Guadalajara stands out as one of the safest cities in Latin America. Several of our Enforcement Agencies through the years have been certified by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA), the Road and Transit Police, Zapopan and Guadalajara Police forces, and recently this year the C5 CommandCenter (Escudo Urbano) obtained the certification.
- Guadalajara's airport has the second highest domestic traffic and isthe third most important in the country in terms of international traffic.
- Guadalajara and Zapopan Metropolitan Police with a task force up to 5,600 police officers and 1,500 patrols. Civil Protection and Fire Department Officers between both cities up to 850 firefighters and 170 operational vehicles.
